

Sharing A Knight's Rosary in Your Parish or Community

Dear Brother Knights and Friends,

Background

A Knight's Rosary was created to help bring people into a deeper, more meaningful experience of prayer—especially through reflection on the life and suffering of Jesus Christ.

Its beginnings trace back to a time of prayer and inspiration during a pilgrimage to Medjugorje, and from there it continued to develop through the life and mission of the Knights of Columbus. From the beginning, it has been closely tied to the Knights' call to strengthen faith and encourage prayer within the Church and the family.

Over the years, more than **10,000 booklets** and **50,000 tapes and CDs** have been shared with individuals and groups across many communities.

These materials are meant to be shared simply, so that more people may encounter Christ through prayer.

A Simple Approach

- Share personally
- Keep it brief
- Offer, don't sell

There is no need for a formal program. A simple, sincere invitation is enough.

Where to Share

- After Mass
- Parish events
- Knights of Columbus meetings
- Small prayer groups

Any setting where people are already gathered is a good opportunity.

A Simple Way to Offer It

You may find it helpful to say something like:

“This has helped many people in their prayer—you're welcome to take one.”

No long explanation is needed.

Sharing A Knight's Rosary in Your Parish or Community

Handling Donations

- Offer materials freely
- Accept free-will donations if appropriate
- Decide ahead of time how you will handle giving

The goal is to make these materials accessible, not transactional.

Important Guidance

- Do not leave materials unattended
- Do not pressure people to take one
- Do not over-explain or try to persuade
- Do not focus on unusual stories or experiences

Keep the focus on prayer.

Keep It Simple

- No tracking or reporting
- No follow-up required
- No need to manage or organize beyond the moment

Simply place *A Knight's Rosary* into someone's hands.

Final Encouragement

Place it into someone's hands—and trust that God will do the rest.
